August Gathering – Recap Joyce Woods

Double Eagle Aviation Academy (DEAA) - Jim Kessler

Jim, current "principal" of the chapter's Double Eagle Aviation Academy started by reviewing the program's history. He noted how in 2013, Joyce Woods had an idea. She organized chapter volunteers to create the initial curriculum.

Since then, coursework has evolved, but the initial framework is still in use today. A highlight from the start, Chile Flight formation team arrives mid-week in style and leads a riveting workshop to create part of a control surface, teaching riveting techniques. The curriculum starts with an actual aircraft Preflight activity. Classroom sessions cover aerodynamics, weather, aircraft control surfaces, compass headings, traffic pattern, and practice reading a sectional chart. Students experience workshops for exposure to electrical circuits, engines, and metal work (riveting). They learn and practice radio communications and plan a flight. Then each student is invited for a special Young Eagles flight, following the route they planned, and applying many of the skills learned.

Since 2019, Jim has taken the program to a whole new level, raising the bar on aerodynamics including calculating Lift. He's incorporated Simulator training, and a competitive Jeopardy quiz which serves as a end-of day review. Throughout the week, guest speakers representing various aviation careers share personal experiences and answer questions: Commercial pilot, mechanic, engineers, air traffic controllers, etc.

About 50 chapter volunteers make DEAA happen each year, several of which show their aircraft one of the mornings. Lunches and snacks are provided each day, currently organized by Pam Kessler.

In response to Jim's presentation, chapter member Bill Donald's reaction was priceless, "*I had no idea all that you do with these kids! It's fantastic!*" Indeed, it is so rewarding to watch as many of these youth further their aviation education. Several DEAA alums are attending college aviation programs, some are working as commercial pilots, mechanics, engineers, etc. *And that's what the excitement is all about!*

We recently received an update from Joel Inventor. He was a DEAA student, and we sponsored his attendance at EAA Air Academy.



"Hello EAA chapter 179,

A lot has changed in the past 3 years since I was given the EAA Advanced Air Academy scholarship. The opportunity to attend the DEA camp and EAA Advanced Air Academy scholarship changed my life for the better. While Covid-19 halted a lot of plans, I had, I still had the aviation bug from the influence of EAA 179 and other STEM camps I had attended in high school. In the beginning of 2021, I was actively looking for an aviation program and had been accepted to the aviation program at the University of North Dakota and Embry-Riddle. My uncle, who is a retired airlines pilot told me of a part 141 aviation program he heard of at Conroe airport in Texas.

After my 1st cross-country

I went for a weekend tour, and after speaking with the program director and being accepted

after many rigorous interviews, I made the decision to attend Lone Star College's Professional Pilot Program. I started the program in August of 2021, and I obtained my private pilot's license in January of this year and in June I completed my instrument rating. I am currently a third of the way through my commercial certificate. I am on track to have my multi-engine along with CFI rating by the spring of 2023. After I finish in 2023, I will take a job as a flight instructor at my flight school US Aviation Academy and build flight experience required so I can start my career as a professional pilot.

If it wasn't for the tremendous encouragement and generosity of the Chapter, I wouldn't be where I am today. I hope to keep in touch and visit the Chapter next time I am in New Mexico for school break. Regards and gratitude,

Long ago (1966), I was intrigued by Jim Bede's efforts to introduce a low cost path to build a "proven" aircraft design. I learned that he was operating out of the Cuyahoga County Airport. I was then flying out of the Wright-Patterson Aero Club, so a cross-country to CGF seemed in order. My roommate (and USAFA classmate) and I hopped in a T-34 and headed off the see what we could find. At CGF we learned that his facility was on the other side of the field; we got the crew car and drove there. We didn't find anyone in the facility, so we walked around to the rear and, peeking through a window, there it was – a BD-1.

Many of you know the rest of the Jim Bede story, but here is a synopsis from <u>La Jetee Press</u>. Bede's story includes much controversy, but 'tis my view that the BD-1 and other of his designs helped launch the kit-built industry that exists today. And the BD-1 became the Grumman American AA-1 Yankee (from which other aircraft were developed from that design).
