Program: Midfield Development Project at AEG

Chapter member and Young Eagle pilot, Kenny Hinkes has been working with the City of Albuquerque Aviation Dept on a MidField Development project at Double Eagle II Airport. The "MidField" project consists of five Phases to develop city owned airport land southwest of the tower.

Plans are to start construction of Phase I this spring, which on completion will include 48 new hangars. Kenny will review current and future plans for this exciting new airport development: <u>High Flying Hangars at Double Eagle II</u>

Editor's note: Our chapter has long hoped to secure our own hangar on the field to serve as a base for our activities. Even after the Reimer Hangar purchase, the Board has continued to explore options. Last year, we reserved the right to purchase a hangar in this project, on behalf of the chapter.
