To me, EAA has always meant – Experimental Airplanes - Experimental Amateur Built Aircraft (EABs).

- Since I joined EAA and Chapter 179, I've become aware of some great examples: actually too numerous to mention here. But of course there is the Chapter's RV-12 Project which was passed along on to the High Desert Flyers (HDF) to complete.
- And there are EABs now in the hands of 2nd or subsequent owners who take care of their airplanes like they built them.

I received my introduction to the hands-on activity of building an airplane when HDF took over completion of the RV-12. As an "amateur apprentice", watching and listening to the experienced builders, I learned a lot about the knowledge and skill required to build an airplane – understanding the plans inside and out, knowing the specifics of parts and materials, having the knowledge and skills to work properly with the tools and materials, and ... the perseverance that is required to complete such a complex project. And I enjoyed every visit that I made to the RAF to work on the RV-12.

These days we're watching Jim (joined soon by Lee) take on the task of finishing the Breezy, built by Warren Cox. They are completing the initial flight testing and building up flight time to shake out any bugs, leading up to selling this popular airplane. (See the October Newsletter)

Now we, the Chapter, have another airplane to work on – the Pietenpol Air Camper Project (particulars are presented later in this Newsletter). Like the RV-12, this presents an opportunity for many Members to participate. Among the Members there exists a vast range of knowledge, skill, and experience, from building with wood and covering with fabric (Emilio), repairing & rebuilding engines and electrics & avionics (Mike R), establishing the flight envelop (Jim K), fetching and returning tools (me), and the many other facets of EAB. The bi-monthly meeting of the Chapter Board of Directors was called to order by our President Jim Kessler via ZOOM on Nov 7.



Spotlight on Dave Otero – GA News The Editor

This is a Short Article, -in– the Newsletter that is. I can't copy the complete article frin GA Bews, so here's a glimpse. Then follow the link to the full article in General Aviation News.

"After reading a magazine article back in 2016 on the risk of "hangar rash" damage to the thin, trailing edges of composite propeller blades, David Otero decided — "before even closing the magazine" — to buy covers to protect his new Whirlwind GA200L propeller.

The only problem was, that in scouring the internet, it appeared that nobody made such a thing. So



Otero simply went to his workshop and made his own.

He's a hands on kinda guy that way.

He had just finished building his RV-7, and before that, he built hundreds of other airplanes. Literally. He had been a final assembly technician for Eclipse Aircraft, the personal jet manufacturer, before it closed its doors in 2009.

To make covers to protect his propeller blades, he "grabbed some neoprene" and fashioned what was to become the first "BladeSox" set — a pair of close-fitting covers that slid over the prop blades much like socks slide over your feet."



Pietenpol Air Camper, Our Next Chapter Project The Editor

Since completion of the RV-12 Project almost 2 years ago, the Chapter has been on the lookout for another build or rebuild project. As mentioned in minutes of the <u>September Chapter Board Meeting</u>, page 5, discussions were under way to obtain the donation of a Pietenpol Air Camper. Recently, the Chapter received the donation through the generosity of Mr Howared Voges.



What is a *Pietenpol Air Camper*? It is a wood and fabric parasol monoplane designed by Bernard Pietenpol in 1928. His goal was to build an airplane that was ",, affordable and easy to construct for home builders". Originally it flew with a Ford Model A engine, but many others have been used since, even converted Corvair engines in the '60s. In the '20s and 30s kits were available and in 2015 Aircraft Spruce began

offering a kit for the airframe. (Wikipedia: Pietenpol Air Camper").

The original specifications: a 2-place airplane, empty weight 610 pounds and gross weight 995 pounds with a 40 hp Model A engine, maximum speed 86 knots, stall 30 knots. The specifications of ours??

— TBD ('tho Jim Kessler will no doubt do the aeronautical math).

Our airplane? Little is known about its history. We understand that it has had a couple of owners over the years and has flown quite a bit. Mr Voges purchased the airplane a few years ago intending to fully refurbish it, starting by dissembling the wings and fuselage and removing the fabric covering and engine. He also passed along logbooks and other associated information.

Emelio Verastegui and Lee Otto tracked down this airplane, worked with Mr Voges for the donation, and they are excited, along with other members, to "get on with" its restoration. From my own visit to see the airplane, it is 1) approachable (its size, method of construction of the wings and fuselage), 2) offers the opportunity to learn new skills (working with a wood airframe, learning about fabric covering, and much more), 3) working with Chapter Members to bring the project to completion, and 4) the pride that will come when the airplane takes to the air.

For the time being, the airplane is in storage while Jim Kessler and Lee Otto complete flying off the hours on the Breezy which is now being hangered in the RAF. But work is getting under way with studying the plans, carefully inspecting the airframe, identifying and deciding what parts and materials will be need, and putting together a plan for when hands-on work commences. There are many, many opportunities for Members to get Hands On. Under the guidance of Lead Builders, we can all gain knowledge and skills that are required for an Amateur Built Airplane. EAA 530 Young Eagles at Deming

The afternoon of October 27th, Joyce and Lance flew their planes to Deming NM to help set up for the October 28 event. There was a NOTAM posted that GPS services may be interrupted in the areas around White Sands Missile Range. Sure enough, we both lost all GPS and ADSB information on the way to Deming. It was great practice to revert to dead reckoning and tuning in VOR's to navigate.

It is incredibly rewarding to bring Young Eagles to outlying New Mexico airports. On Oct 28, the city of Deming put on a Fly-In, offering free lunch for the community, craft fair vendors, and diligent Rose Longmire of Chapter 530 worked with EAA to get approval to host Young Eagle flights. The Mayor of Deming spoke to the crowd, explaining how the community benefits from the airport for medical, fire, and business support. Will Fitzpatrick of NM Aviation Division monitored the radio and helped coordinate from the ramp. Will even bailed Lance Hunter out when one of his Bose Headsets fell apart. Will loaned Lance his Bose A-20 so the flights could continue. Tony and Bob from Desert Aviation provided super service to pilots.




