How about that Ford Tri-Motor? I must make a correction to last month's Notes from Our President. Each of the Tri-Motor's engines originally produced 300 horsepower, but today each engine on the Tri-Motor produces 450 HP. So it has a few more ponies behind those propellers. As I write this, we have completed only the first day of the tour, but that day was a great success.

The RAF insulation was installed. Garrity did a great job. The hangar looks great, and the insulation will make working in the hangar in both summer and winter a pleasure. We'll start working on the pneumatic manifold this month.

We have had some interest in the Breezy. Our potential buyer is looking for a partner and a hangar. If you can help out with either, please let me know. We have 24 hours of flight time on it. We are planning to increase the control stick length in both the front and rear seat. That modification should happen shortly, and we'll be back in the air.

The April 2nd Board meeting was mostly about LOEFI. We have identified some lead positions we need to fill. We will be asking for volunteers to fill three important positions: a site coordinator, a logistics lead and a Fly Mart

Lead. If you feel like one of these positions is calling your name or if you have questions about one, let me know.

Young Eagles for May will be on the 4th. We had a great pilot response for April, unfortunately the April winds forced us to cancel. Let's keep that momentum in May.

On May 11th we have an additional opportunity to introduce some older aviation enthusiasts to flying with a Flying Start event. George Young is leading that effort. He needs a few pilots to take some adults flying that day.

Our next Gathering is on April 16th. We have a builder presentation scheduled. The Gathering will be at Craft Republic. We have arranged for the larger downstairs room this time.

Applications for Double Eagle Aviation Academy continue to come in. This month will be our big planning month. Doug Dingman has had to step back from DEAA planning so we are reorganizing the planning effort.

Time for Renewal Chapter 179 membership, that is . . .

It is the time of the year for your membership dues to be renewed.

Per Article V, Section 2 of the Chapter Bylaws, membership renewal dues are required for the period of January thru December of the Membership Year and are payable from December

of the previous year thru March of the present year. Dues paid outside of that period are NOT pro-rated. Membership runs only from January thru December of a given year.




Alex Martinez
