Additionally, we are working with a single runway, so a crosswind landing is very likely. Consider what the winds will be upon your return before your departure. Know your crosswind limits as well as the airplane's recommended limit. They may not be the same.

Financials: John DeWitt reported on activity, mostly scholarship related. Ray Scholar funds were received from EAA once Christian Guerra soloed. Significant contributions are coming in, honoring long time members Dean Wadsworth and Rick Richter. Besides the great public visibility from the Ford Tri-Motor visit, our chapter also gets a commission from EAA for seats and merchandise sold. All good news!

Scholarship updates: Jocelyn Muñiz passed her checkride! Daisy Ortega soloed. Ashlee Simpkins is close to soloing. Dominic Martinez has been nominated to EAA for our first of two 2024 Ray Scholarships (\$11,000 each) with PPL completion expected within 12 months.

Flying Start (May 11) event plans were reviewed, a program to orient adults interested to become pilots. George Young and Mark Sturm presenting. EAA offers 2 KOSH wristbands (a \$145 value each) for chapters who conduct such an event in May. These will be offered for sale– if interested contact Lance Hunter.

24 students, 57 volunteers, 4 simulators, 4 helicopters, 31 airplanes! 14 Young Eagle pilots!

After an introduction to aircraft pre-flight, students dove into the curriculum of Aerodynamics, Weather, Compass Instruments, Communications, Weight and Balance and Navigation (compass headings, sectional charts, flight planning). Classes were interspersed with career speakers representing Airline Pilots, Charter and Air Medical Pilots, Law Enforcement and Military Helicopter Pilots, Drone pilots, Flight Testing, Mechanical/ Aeronautical Engineering, ATC, Aircraft Mechanics!

Did we say helicopters? The 58th Special Operations Wing of the USAF at Kirtland flew students and a few lucky volunteers in an HH-60W/G Blackhawk and UH-1N. State Police and APD showed their helos as well.

Chile Flight thrilled students and parents (and a few siblings), arriving in style for the metal aircraft build workshop. Two biplanes: Ron Harmon's Christen Eagle AND Emilio's new Skyote (pictured above)! So many great pilots and airplanes.



The week closed with inspiration and advice from commercial pilot Rowan Phlieger, our first Ray Scholar (now with NetJets) and parents of recent Ray Scholar, Mia Alderete: Raymond and Cynthia Alderete. NM Aviation Director, Pete Rael offered

his congratulations and industry perspective. Students received certificates of completion and congrats after visiting with various organizations standing ready to help on the next stage of their aviation journeys: Civil Air Patrol, JROTC, Albuquerque Aviation Academy, Bode Flight School, Albuquerque Soaring Club, CNM Technology, and the US Air Force. A Memorial for Rick Richter The Editor

Bob and Kat Richter-Sand and the family of the late Rick Richter invited Rick's many friends to a Memorial in his honor. Folks gathered in Chapter 179's hangar, the Reimer Aircraft Factory aka RAF, at Double Eagle II on May 31st. In response to Rick's request, this Memorial was his preferred way to honor his legacy and lifelong devotion to general aviation.

Bob and Kat along with their son Matt presented a collection of photos and other mementos reflecting Rick's many years and the many aviation activities that he engaged in: father and grandfather, pilot, sky diver, as a builder, and an overall supporter of EAA, Chapter 179, and the Chapter's activities. They also showed two videos that highlighted Rick's adventurous nature and his contributions to developing future pilots:

- 1) A video of Rick's sky-diving experience, a long-held wish which took place when he turned 80 years old.
- A video from KRQE following Rick as a pilot for a Young Eagles event, giving a Young Eagle a truly great introduction to flying and flying an airplane.

Again at Rick's request: his favorite poem, *High Flight*, was presented to close the (brief) review of his life; I think that it reflected what aviation meant to him. And Kat presented a check, a contribution in Rick's honor for the Chapter's Scholarship Program. Thank you Kat and Eileen Richter and your family members for making this donation from Rick's estate on his behalf.

As part of the Memorial, Bob, Kat, and Matt offered a catered lunch and refreshments that contributed to bringing together people who knew Rick. It created the opportunity to exchange memories of who Rick was and how he influenced their lives and the lives of others. And for desert, Kat's friend Barbara brought homemade



cookies and Konrad brought two cakes with frosting that framed photos of Rick.
