*Then our program!* Bill Hutson, Zenith CH-750 STOL aircraft builder reminded us that he presented to our chapter previously although with so many new faces, only a few remember. He pulled his first rivet on 12 May 2011. He presented when we regularly met at the Copper Canyon Café on Jefferson.



Titled, "*The Saga Continues (but the end is in sight)*", Bill announced acquiring the coveted Airworthiness Certificate in September. Thirteen years and 22 days since he started, the end is in sight!



He shared a special moment when he realized he was about to pull the last rivet (photo left). He realized how significant it was and paused to collect a couple fellow builders to join him. Mark Sturm and Gwen Walcott have monitored his progress from hangars nearby and appreciated the significance of that moment.

#### Acro II Project - for Display at Albuquerque Aviation Academy (formally SAMS)

Initially hoping some miracle builder would come along to finish this project, Warren Cox decided maybe it would be best if it served some educational purpose. He looked to chapter members to help find a good use of his years of craftsmanship.

Sporting a custom built tilt over clear canopy, running your hand over this all fiberglass fuselage, it's smoothness makes you want to help find a good home. Warren's Acro II is beautiful although unfinished.

Exploring options for an educational donation we finally inquired with Aeronautics Director of the Albuquerque Aviation Academy, Dr. Lauren Chavez. Always enthusiastic, but recognizing challenges in such projects, she thought the school might just need such a plane on display outdoors.

Chapter members Warren Cox, Lee Otto, Dan Horschel and Joyce Woods initially met last May with Lauren to explore the idea. Our team identified steps needed to prepare the aircraft. We indicated that we can't design and install a base to properly secure the aircraft in a sustainable fashion. It is on school grounds, so needs to hold up to anything!. Time passed and school leaders recently asked if the project was continuing. Warren, Konrad Werner, and Joyce met Lauren and Dean Matt Dixson who is committed to get the needed mounting.

Meanwhile, Warren and Konrad have gotten the bug. They both keep showing up to look at something, resulting in a workday. They've made

Warren and Konrad started to prepare the interior by removing the instrument panel, rudder pedals, cables, etc. Usable parts will be donated to the chapter to sell. huge headway to prepare the aircraft for assembly, removing unneeded parts for donation to the chapter. They opened up access to the wing roots and gear mount. The aircraft will be mounted without the gear or engine. Fuselage holes such as for gear and exhaust pipes will be sealed. Control surfaces will be secured. Fitting the wings and finish work will require several volunteers.

#### • Provide a copy of an unofficial school transcript.

•Provide at least one reference letter (no more than three) from someone other than a family member who is familiar with your motivation, ability, and potential regarding aviation.

•An important criteria is the applicant's commitment to pursuing aviation.

#### Introducing: Sean Babbitt Sean Babbitt

Hi EAA community! I wanted to introduce myself as a new member of both EAA 179 and the Albuquerque metro area.

I come to Albuquerque after spending the past 25 years in government service as a Naval Officer (Surface) for 21 years and a GS for the past four. My wife Margaret, daughters, MJ and Marian come here after living in Japan and then Belgium since 2017 with the past six years spent at and around NATO.



I earned my private pilot endorsement in 2005 while in Norfolk, VA flying the venerable ole Piper Tomahawk and her 110 horses under the hood. My flying adventure stopped as my Navy career sped into high gear and our two wonderful daughters came into our lives. When we got to New Mexico I thought that I would try and reengage with the pilot community and through some serendipitous luck, I met Lance Hunter at a Cirrus migration event in Arizona.



I spent a LOT of time at sea while in the Navy, so seeing exactly zero white caps on the horizon in Albuquerque I knew it was the right place for me to stay. During my naval career I was in the

wardroom of one Frigate, three destroyers, one cruiser, one carrier strike group staff, and a fleet staff, all of which were considered sea duty! In total, I spent 13 years attached to sea going commands. During that time, I was part of 31 Tomahawk Land Attack Cruise Missile strikes in both Iraq and California (darn pesky Californians), two Standard Missile surface to air launches, and countless 5" gun exercises shooting at targets both at sea and on land.

They say join the Navy and see the world, and that is mostly true since more than 2/3 of the world is covered by water! But when we did pull in, I got to experience Japan, Singapore, Malaysia, Philippines, Indonesia, Australia, Brunei, Bahrain, Spain, with many of them coming multiple times (seven times in Singapore and I have absolutely no idea how many times in Bahrain). While at NATO I was fortunate to work on international initiatives, including developing technical arrangements with countries like Portugal and Greece for education exchange initiatives. As the Principal Advisor for the NATO Special Operations University (NSOU), I directed business development and outreach efforts to ensure our Allies had the best Special Operations education available. It was a joy and a privilege to represent the United States in front of our European Allies.



Even through all the port visits, watch-standing, and gun exercises I still wanted to be in the air. All

the ships I served on were helicopter capable and we were lucky enough to have squadron detachments onboard for a vast majority of time we were at sea. It was a wonderful experience to sit in the Combat Information Center (CIC) and say "Green Deck for helicopter launch" then watch the birds take off and head out on patrol.

Leadership is at the heart of what I am used to doing. I've served as an Executive Officer on guided missile destroyers, where I oversaw ship-wide operations and maintenance during critical deployments. But the camaraderie and resilience of a team environment have always motivated me, and I sense this Chapter will offer more of the same. I have already been able to play ramp safety for the Young Eagles and then help cut out a table section using every safety precaution we could think of right Eric....!

Thank you for welcoming me into the club with open arms. I look forward to getting back in the air when I can and learning from all of you airborne professionals!
