

We held our first rally of 2025 on February 1. Thinking cold February weather, start time was delayed until 11 AM. And of course we are having an


extraordinarily warm winter!! Oh well!! **We flew 52 Young Eagles**. Thank you to the ground crew and pilots that made it happen.

Minimum Requirements:

- Be 15 to 25 years of age and a resident of New Mexico.
- Describe your interest in aviation and your future including your aviation goal(s), how much (\$) you are requesting, specific justification for how it will be spent, any connections to EAA Chapter 179, any aviation experience and achievements, and how you will give back to the community after reaching your goals.
- Provide a copy of an unofficial school transcript.
- **Provide at least one reference letter** (no more than three) from someone other than a family member who is familiar with your motivation, ability, and potential regarding aviation.
- An important criteria is the applicant's commitment to pursuing aviation.

The Double Eagle Aviation Academy (DEAA) offers a fun and challenging week at the airport! Students ages 14 – 17 will explore a future in aviation. Students will learn about many facets of flying and airplanes:

- learn about career opportunities in aviation from professionals
- learn and practice reading weather reports
- learn how to control pitch, roll, and yaw
- learn the importance of balancing weight in the plane
- learn and practice interpreting the instrument "Six Pack"
- learn how aluminum structures are designed to be strong
- learn what is inside the motors of airplanes
- learn and practice the legs of a traffic pattern in a simulator
- learn and practice communicating at non-towered and towered airports
- learn and practice assembling a simple electrical wiring circuit
- learn and practice riveting and rolling aluminum to make part of an aileron
- learn and practice conducting an aircraft pre-flight inspection
- learn and practice planning a flight
- visit the Double Eagle II control tower


Preparing for Paint






