February Chapter Gathering – RECAP by Eric Achen

A Questair Venture Adventure

Will Fox, Questair Venture builder and EAA Technical Counselor shared his experience with this aircraft which operates on the edge of the envelope. A 240 kt airplane, the Questair Venture is an exhilarating high performance amateur built aircraft with an 800—1000 nm range.

He reviewed safety issues and how they were resolved, including interlocked brakes and steering which resulted in multiple incidents of loss

of control on the runway. Sharing example after example, Will demonstrated the importance of collaborating with the Questair builder and owner community to improve safety. Together they have solved some tough design issues and Will is clearly a key contributor as he is with the builder community in general.

Will currently serves as the Los Alamos/Santa Fe EAA Chapter 691 President and has also built a Pegazair.



Dog Rescues – Feb 2025 Emilio Verastegue



Not long ago, I received a call from Brenda Walsh, a flight coordinator for the Pilots & Paws Organization, with whom I have dealt with on several occasions. She is based in Amarillo, Texas. She asked me if I could be available to fly some dogs from Hereford Texas to Albuquerque on a recent Tuesday. This particular flight would have two dogs to transport. I told her that I was available and could help her out, if the weather was agreeable. It turned out that not all of the pieces of her puzzle fell into place for Tuesday, but did come together for the following day, Wednesday.

However, the trip details had changed and now we would have three dogs, not two, and they were three completely

different dogs than from the original trip specs. Details like these matter only to the coordinator, but I was happy to transport as many dogs as I could carry safely!







The weather was much better on Wednesday anyway, so everyone was happier because of it. Since Barry Kromer, and his wife Carol, were in town visiting friends and other fellow Chapter members, I asked him to accompany me on the flight. He agreed! He is a good dog wrangler!



So, off we went to Hereford Texas early that Wednesday morning, lifting off at 0805, over-flying the Sunport, making our way eastbound, initially at 9,500 MSL. As it happened, we did not have much tailwind to make our flight any faster. That was disappointing, but the air was glass smooth that morning! We finally landed at Herfeord Texas at 0932, so we made pretty good time. The dogs arrived at the airport from two different shelters. The first lady brought the two small bulldogs, siblings Tugboat and Mo. Very cute and very small! The second lady, accompanied by her daughter, Harper, brought Greta Garbo to us from the different shelter.

After refueling, we put the two small dogs in the crate together and Greta was strapped into a seat with a harness and a seatbelt. We took off at 1005 for the return leg. We climbed up to 10,500 MSL to avoid the high terrain in front of us and finally arrived at KAEG at 1141.





Karl Wolf, based in Moriarty, was the second pilot involved in the transport of the dogs that day. His aircraft of choice is a Grumman Lynx, which is a Grumman model AA1-C. His registration is N39070. After moving the dogs from my Bonanza to his aircraft, he departed KAEG at 1206, bound for KGJT (Grand Junction, CO) with all three dogs and arrived safely 2:27 minutes later. Mission complete!



It is tremendously satisfying for me to be able to help Pilots & Paws transport these animals when I can. Sometimes, due to mitigating circum-

stances, I cannot help with their transportation and that is troublesome to me. I wish I could help all the animals find a good home and a better living situation. I am a dog lover to say the least, and in fact, we have two of our own at home. Leo is a "Rescue Dog" from a shelter in Santa Fe. Our younger dog, Sochi, is a full Lab from a breeder in Ohio. Her ride home was in the Bonanza when she was 8 weeks old!

I wanted to write this story because I wanted to emphasize the fact that flying, airplanes and aviation itself can be useful, fun, and satisfying. Of course, everyone knows that you can go places via air travel, that you can take cargo from one place to another (just ask me how I know), and that you can even have fun flying seaplanes and gliders, but not many people are aware of the fact that air transportation is the safest and fastest way to transport animals of any size. For General Aviation pilots like myself, it is a very satisfying and gratifying thing to do. Volunteering time and money to organizations, such as Pilots & Paws, is a meaningful way to give back to the community, to put forth effort to aid and comfort animals that have not had the best life circumstances, and it also puts aviation in the spotlight for the public to see the good it can achieve!

I will continue to volunteer for Pilots & Paws for as long as I can!
