Notes from the Editor

George Young, an "old" pilot

Recently I've come across numerous Facebook posts on VORs, which brought back many fond memories. Back *in the day*, I first learned (and used) pilotage navigation; it was easy and reliable for my first cross-countries: USAFA to La Junta and back to Pine Valley Airstrip -follow highways, fly towards Pikes Peak on the last leg, visible from 70 miles away. Later in Ohio I learned that pilotage navigation was difficult – so many trees and the roads went in all directions, not the grid pattern like 'out west'. I even got lost during a checkout at the Aero Club at Wright Field.

VORs then became navigation aid of choice. I enjoyed planning cross-countries, trips from Ohio to Kansas to visit family. Starting with a sectional chart, I would identify the string of stations along the route, then build a station-by-station flight plan with frequencies, radials, and distances. Following that plan became very easy, with contact with Flight Service Stations for position reports and updated weather along the way.

Does the airplane you fly even have a VOR receiver and display? GPS is great, but ... oh .. the Good Ole Days.

Program: Over New Mexico and the Southwest, by Jeff Gilkey

Jeff has been involved in aviation most of his life. He flew hanggliders in Calif and NM in the 80's and 90's, including over 200 flights from the Sandia Crest. He studied aerospace engineering in college, and worked on navigation, guidance and control systems at Sandia Labs, retiring in 2016. Since 2004, he's flown his experimental light sport weight-shift control aircraft or "trike", logging >2500 hours on cross country trips into nearly every corner of New Mexico and surrounding states. For Jeff, the trike is the perfect flying machine, combining the intuitive natural wing controls of a hangglider, and the long distance, low speed cruise capability of an efficient engine with a large gas tank.

Jeff serves as Secretary of the Board of the New Mexico Pilots Association (NMPA). He writes an "Obscure and Scenic New Mexico" column for their newsletter. Jeff enjoys the pilot camaraderie met through the NMPA and believes it is a great way to create a network of friendly flying contacts across the state.



Jeff has been happily married to his wife Amy for 46 years, with 2 amazing adult daughters, Nyssa and Lindsay. Jeff has also raised a series of golden retrievers. He always wanted to fly with his dog in the back seat, but knowing that would terrify them, he opted for a life-sized toy dog.

EAA is offering recognition for Young Eagles pilots who join the "25 for 2.5" campaign to reach 2.5 million Young Eagles in the coming months. In addition, participating EAA chapters that assist in new volunteer pilot recruitment will be eligible for extra Young Eagles credits that can be used to obtain further resources for Young Eagles rallies or cover tuition fees of deserving youths for the EAA Air Academy residence camp held each summer in Oshkosh.

Fly 25 for 2.5: Volunteer Young Eagles pilots who fly 25 Young Eagles or more from October 1, 2025, through July 31, 2026, will be awarded a limited-edition commemorative cap to thank you for your participation in helping us hit this significant milestone.

From Matthew Croshaw:

It's been over a year and a half of flight training to become a pilot, and I was primarily just waiting until I turned 17 to be eligible. Eventually, I achieved all my requirements, and my birthday came around.

I picked December 29th to do my checkride; however, due to weather conditions, it got pushed a day later to the 30th at 7am. I woke up that day and showed up 30 minutes early. After a bunch of paperwork, we began the oral, which I did quite well on. My DPE was Lauren Chavez, an educator at the Albuquerque Aviation Academy. We continued the checkride with the flight portion, the part I was a bit more nervous about, but all the maneuvers went well, and I nailed my short field landing, right on the thousand-foot markers.

On the taxi back to the ramp, Lauren informed me that I had passed, and from there she printed out the long-awaited certificate. The checkride as a whole was a lot easier than I imagined, and I do feel like I did overstudy. And, just like many people I've talked to, I did not sleep well the night before. But overall, I'm excited to finally officially be a pilot, and I'm currently taking family members up!
