Flight Service Online, by Rose Marie Kern

By now most pilots know that Lockheed Martin Flight Service is not only available by phone, as it has always been, but you can access Flight Service data and information via



their Pilot Portal. (<u>www.1800wxbrief.com</u>). In past articles I've mentioned that you can now use the AFSS PilotWeb site to access all the same weather and graphics that flight service specialists use during preflight briefings, and file your flight plans on the same site free of charge.

The latest addition to the services offered is a visual display that will help you to determine what time is most likely for you to depart and have VFR conditions along the route. The Departure Advisor tool shows what TAF conditions are forecasted to be across your route of flight for up to 13 departure time options on a single page. Use the Evaluate button in the Departure Date & Time field of the flight plan forms on the website to view a list of times and TAF Stations. The green buttons under the stations show when each station is expected to be IFR, MVFR, or VFR.

Another new service offers pilots a way of activating and closing VFR flight plans without having to call flight service. The PilotWeb website allows you to sign up for EasyActivate/Easy Close - where you can do both from your cell phone with a text message!

Pilots that register for these services receive an EasyActivate[™] email 30 minutes prior to the estimated time of departure for each filed VFR flight plan. The email contains a link to activate the flight. Select the link and that's it – you're flight plan is activated, and you do receive immediate confirmation. An EasyClose[™] email is sent 30 minutes prior to your estimated time of arrival (based on your actual departure time) and works the same way.

Registering for an account is easy...check it out at <u>https://lmfsweb.afss.com/Website/login</u>. For more information you can go to 1800wxbrief.com.

The list shows a route that begins at Altoona, PA (AOO) and goes to Macon, GA (MCN). The tool calculates what time your aircraft should be over each station in between based on the flight information you've input. In this scenario, as long as the aircraft leaves Altoona by 2300z, the TAFs indicate VFR conditions all the way to MCN. After that the conditions are expected to lower enroute.

Scholarships and DEAA Opportunities

HELP US SPREAD THE WORD! It's that scholarship application time of year!

EAA 179 AVIATION SCHOLARSHIPS - due February 15, 2015

Our annual Aviation Scholarship program is also underway with a February 15th application deadline. EAA Chapter 179 presents annual scholarship awards to candidates pursuing aviation education including flight training, A&P certification, etc. Applicants must be 25 years of age or less. Interested candidates may read full details and download the application from our website. Last year, we granted three \$1000 scholarships! The amount and number of grants are determined each year and contingent on available funding. Applications must be received by February 15. Recipients are notified and awarded certificates at the March Chapter meeting. Scholarships are paid directly to the school or instructor on behalf of the student recipient.

2015 EAA AIR ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIP – due January 6, 2015

We've confirmed funding of a scholarship to attend the EAA Air Academy in Oshkosh, Wisconsin next summer and are accepting applications (application attached). Per the 3 local youth that attended last year, "it's awesome!"

The EAA Air Academy is a fun-filled aviation camp experience. Since 1984, experienced instructors and dedicated staff have shared the knowledge and lore of aviation through hands-on workshop, classroom, and outdoor experiences with young people. Tuition includes all instruction, materials, meals and lodg-ing in the beautiful EAA Air Academy Lodge, located at Pioneer Airport on the grounds of the EAA AirVenture Museum in Oshkosh. *Transportation to and from Oshkosh is the responsibility of the participant, with free pick-up provided from the Appleton, Wisconsin airport.*

Chapter 179's Air Academy Scholarship (\$1055.00) may be applied towards tuition for the **Basic Air Academy** (Ages 14-15), **Advanced Air Academy** (Ages 16 -18), or the **Advanced Air Academy / Sport Air** (Age 16-19), with dates based on EAA availability. See the EAA Air Academy website for more details. Air Academy candidates will be notified in January and the scholarship will be awarded at our March 17th chapter meeting along with EAA Chapter 179 flight training scholarships. Since local funds are limited, we encourage anyone interested in the Air Academy to also apply for some of the many scholarships offered from EAA Headquarters: *EAA Air Academy scholarships*. Applicants should be thoughtful on applying and note that some deadlines are December 31.

Double Eagle Aviation Adventure 2015 – coming soon

We've initiated plans for a 2015 Double Eagle Aviation Adventure but are not yet accepting applications. Tentative dates: June 8 - 12 with Young Eagles flights on June 13.
