Timeless Voices of Aviation

Most members of the EAA have heard the name of Paul Poberezny. He is familiar to thousands of EAA members, and if you've been to the Oshkosh AirVenture you've seen street signs boasting the name. But why is he famous?



Have you wondered what it was like to fly a fighter plane in World War II, Korea or Vietnam? How did Bob Hoover become an aerobatics legend? What drove Frank Borman to start flying and eventually go blasting off to circle the moon?

The EAA Museum has made it a priority to use today's technology to preserve the thoughts, feelings and memories of anyone who loves and has worked with aircraft of any type and in any way. Mechanics, Air Traffic Controllers, Aviation weather forecasters, FBO operators, airport managers as well as pilots of aircraft large and small are invited to talk about how aviation is a part of their lives.

LI was doing a book signing at AirVenture, when a man came up to me and asked if I would be interviewed for a collection of videos called "Timeless Voices of Aviation" at the EAA Aviation Museum. I had some time the next day, so I wandered over with a friend.

The Paul Harvey Theater is tucked away in the back of the ground floor. The setup is very simple – I sat on a chair with a lapel microphone and the interviewer sat out of the picture next to the camera. He asked leading questions which were eventually cut out of the final video so that it appeared I was simply describing what it was like to become an air traffic controller in the years after the strike of 1981. He asked questions about the job itself and about the challenges of being a woman in the profession during that era.

My friend, Jon Daffer, was watching and after they interviewed me they sat him in the chair and had him talk about all the different kinds of aircraft he built and flew, his experiences as a CFII and his career in Air Traffic Control.

That's the beauty of Timeless Voices. They are not just taking famous or important people. This oral history program gathers the perspectives and experiences of everyone from airport line boys to WASPS to a guy who designs and builds custom propellers.

Historians normally have to slog through mountains of written memoirs or snippets of newsprint to capture the essence of an event. *Timeless Voices* weaves an intricate, comprehensive tapestry of man's desire to break the bonds of gravity through first hand personal accounts and observations.

Look back on your own involvement with aviation. What have you seen or done in your own lifetime that you can share with future generations? Have you built an RV7 from rivet to paint? What advice would you pass on to others?

You can participate in the quest to gather these invaluable stories by going to the EAA's website and searching "Timeless Voices". There is a link that says "Share Your Story" which allows anyone to contact the administrators of the program and set up an interview. It does not have to take place at the museum and you can include previously recorded video footage if it is relevant.

While you are on the site you can search their online database and find some pretty interesting stories. Living veterans from WWII are becoming scarce, but through *Timeless Voices* you can hear the fear and determination of several people associated with the famous B-29 Doolittle Raid on Japan.

Search by using either a name or a keyword. Because there are so many stories recorded, the website is not comprehensive. Over a hundred at a time are available. You can try and find videos on a specific topic – simply type in a word like "Doolittle" on the Keyword line. It will return a list of names whose videos are associated with your keyword.

I typed in "National Guard" and found the video of Cleon Thomton. Cleon was born in 1920 and lived in Montevideo, Minnesota. For me this was interesting because my Dad, Vitus Kern, was born in 1922 and lived only 30 miles away from Cleon. (Don't you love those old Bohemian names!) Like Cleon, Dad was also in the Minnesota National Guard. Although my Dad passed away over a decade ago, I felt a sense of connection as Cleon described how he transitioned from the Guard into the Army as the nation entered WWII.

If you like a specific type of aircraft use it for the keyword, or just browse the list of "most popular". By doing that I found a segment detailing how Jerry McLaughlin restored the iconic B-17 Flying Fortress, "City of Savannah."

So when you are tired of slap happy comedies and flying robots on TV and want to listen to history as told by those who lived it, check out *Timeless Voices*! Rose Marie Kern worked in Air Traffic Control for 34 years. Her memoir, *Stress is Relative*, of being a woman in that demanding profession is available through Amazon or on her website <u>www.rosemariekern.com</u>.



NMPA Call to Action On Proposed NM Dept. of Game and Fish Rule

Hello aviator friends,

The New Mexico Pilots Association, along with the New Mexico Airstrip Network and the Recreational Aviation Association, seeks your participation in a Call to Action.

The Call to Action is regarding a proposed New Mexico Department of Game and Fish rule change regarding use of aircraft over statewide hunting areas. The proposed change will eliminate the long standing "48 hour rule" and make it unlawful "for any individual, for the purpose of hunting, to locate or assist in locating a protected species from or with the aid of an aircraft or drone. . . during the period beginning on August 1 and ending on January 31 of each license year".
