NEW MEXICO KITFOX S7 SUPER SPORT

I EARNED MY PRIVATE pilot certificate when I was 17 by taking a job at the FBO pumping gas, washing airplanes, mopping floors, and scrubbing toilets. I picked up a tailwheel endorsement before I graduated from high school and took my prom date to dinner in a Cub. When I decided to build an airplane, I considered several aircraft and found the Kitfox S7 really does a lot of things well. I'm an engineer, so I made a weighted decision matrix, and for my mission, nothing really came close. I started building in January 2018. I can't say enough about the Kitfox build manual and the level of support that the factory provides. There were very few hiccups and frustrations in the build. On April 7, 2019, N603EM took to the air for the first time.

The aircraft flies behind a Rotax 914 turbocharged engine mated to an Airmaster electric constant-speed prop swinging 70-inch WhirlWind blades. The panel is from Advanced Flight Systems and is built around a single Dynon HDX 11-inch display. The setup includes a dual-axis autopilot, also from Dynon. The covering is Poly Fiber with an Aero-Thane topcoat. It lands on 22-inch Desser Aero Classic tundra tires and a Scott ABI-3200 tail wheel with a T3 suspension spring. I want to thank my wife and children for their patience, understanding, and support during the build. I'm a really lucky man. Flying an airplane that I built has really been the capstone of my life as a pilot. 244

How Can These Scholarships Be Used?

The Albuquerque Chapter 179 of the Experimental Aircraft Association presents annual scholarship awards to candidates pursuing aviation education including flight training, A&P certification, etc. Applicants must be 25 years of age or less and residents of New Mexico. The amount and number of grants are determined each year and contingent on available funding. Applications must be received by February 15, 2020. Recipients are notified and awarded certificates at the March Chapter meeting. Scholarships must be focused on their aviation endeavors and are paid directly to the school or instructor on behalf of the student recipient.

Examples of how these funds can be used are:

- Working toward certification, including CFI fees, and aircraft rental or tuition
- FAA testing fees
- FAA textbooks, review guides, and such

Scholarship funds are not used for general studies and school expenses.

In 2017 to 2019, we awarded over \$26,000 to seventeen applicants! Good luck; we relish the opportunity to support you in your aviation endeavors!
